1. A week and a half ago was the annual HFMM missionary retreat, where over 300 missionaries and their children spent three days and nights resting, having fun and being blessed in different ways. I always love being a part of these kind of events, knowing as I do how important they are to the missionaries and their families! The final days of planning were a bit hard as we lost several key staff members the day before the retreat started, but God had a plan and we were able find the needed staff to replace those who could not come. Praising God for yet another successful event and praying that all of the missionaries went home feeling blessed and restored!

2. As many of you know Nathan, Nubia and I were robbed at gunpoint by a taxi driver that was taking us home after church three weeks ago. We give thanks for the Lord's protection during the robbery, not a hair on our heads was touched or harmed, and in the end does anything else really matter? We are also thankful for the generous donations that some of our supporters sent to help replace the stolen items. Please keep both Nubia and me in your prayers as we recover from this event. We are both doing well considering, but we have a lot of things to work out.

We feel that this is the Lord's plan for us as we start to move forward. However Brandy is still short 50 hours of flight time to be able to get a job as a commercial pilot here in Honduras. Please pray with us that he will be able to get these missing hours

within the next few months and that he will quickly find a job as a pilot once he leaves the air force.
